



**“Building back better”**

\$6bn to be spent on “building back better” after the recent cyclones and floods as part of a National Resilience Plan.



**Cyclone & Flood Relief**

\$1bn cyclone and flood recovery; to be used for flood protection, for Waka Kotahi and councils to repair roading, for repairs and potential relocations of schools, and for the repair of rail connections.



**Trustee Tax**

Trustee tax rate to be raised from 33% to 39%. It is expected that this change will generate a further \$350mil in tax revenue per year.



**Transport costs**

\$327mil for free public transport for children under 13, and half price fares for under 25s. This lies within the “cost of living” support package.



**Transport**

\$120mil to add another 25 charging hubs to the electric vehicle (EV) charging network, and grants towards purchase of low emissions heavy vehicles.



**Gaming**

\$160mil to support growth in the gaming sector with a 20% rebate for video game developers.



**Education**

\$4.9bn to increase skills, reduce class sizes, and increase teacher pay.



**Climate Change**

\$300mil to boost green finance investment fund.



**Family**

20 free hours of early childhood education (ECE) has been extended to include 2 years olds. This was previously available for 3 – 5 year olds. This lies within the “cost of living” support package.



**Infrastructure**

\$71bn over 5 years to be used for new and existing infrastructure projects; focusing on transport, housing, defence, and education.



**Science**

\$451mil for investment in multi-institutional scientific research hubs.



**Energy efficiency**

\$403m to expand Warmer Kiwi Homes Programme by lowering energy bills. This lies within the “cost of living” support package.



**Households**

\$3.56bn for 3,000 new public homes by June 2025. This is in addition to the 14,050 public homes which have already been funded to June 2024.



**Health**

\$1.3bn for health worker pay increases, investment in employment of an additional 500 nurses, and investment to reduce waiting lists.



**Health**

\$619mil to remove the \$5 co-payment on pharmacy prescriptions. This lies within the “cost of living” support package.



**Community**

\$223mil to improve housing outcomes for Maori. \$863m for disability support services. Further investments in programmes for safer communities. Funding for education and transport for those living in rural communities.
